Lent – a time for reflection...

The more I think of it, this past year has been a period of never-ending reflection. It seems as though all of the meetings I've attended lately have had time for reflection, with much of the conversation being somewhat negative or melancholy. The challenge we face now as more and more activities return in-person is how we can see the positive aspects of the past year and continue to incorporate them into our new routines.

For the past three years I have been a board member of the Twin Cities American Guild of Organists. Our chapter is robust and very active and in a typical year schedules many concerts, conferences and socials. This final year of my term has been slightly different as we have had to adjust what we offer to our members. Thinking of new ways to engage listeners and share organ music in a world where organists are in ever-decreasing supply and demand has been an ongoing challenge but spurred new ideas of sharing music with new listeners. Our meeting also covered how many organists' roles may have changed over the past year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. I reflect on my position at Bethel and realize that my normal day-to-day routines are miles away from what a director of music would typically be doing. It is not a problem unique to me or just Bethel either. Many people I have talked to across different fields share similar stories. If you are employed, take a moment to reflect on the way your role may have changed over the past year. Take a moment to reflect on how your daily routines have morphed over the last year. Take a moment to reflect on the positive that has come out of these changes.


Reflect.

So once more, reflect.





As you might know, our shared sabbatical continues with the work of the congregation around Cultural Competence Building. Here are ways that you can be a part of the action!

- Take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI). There is no cost to you.
- Join all the opportunities we offer (Faith Forum, Movie Nights, Book Club, etc.).
- Watch for more information and opportunities concerning our Loneliness Project.
- Do the Breaking the Chain devotion found in the Lent bags. Be sure to check out both sides. Recognize the connection to Sunday and Wednesday worship.
- Shop in places where you find yourself in the minority and observe cultural similarities and differences ~ with no judgment.
- Support minority-owned businesses.
- Listen to podcasts and read blogs that highlight how various cultures cooperate or collide. Follow similar pages/people on Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc.
- Find ways to educate yourself with articles, books, site visits, and travel experiences and share your learning with others.

We would still like to get at least 50-70 more people to take the IDI in the next year, so please come to one of the **Initial Information Sessions** this month:

- ** Sunday, March 7 at 8:30 PM (for the parents after the kids go to bed)
- ** Tuesday, March 30 at 6:30 PM

Also, Pastor Brenda and Mary are rethinking their time away for this Sabbatical. Although the plan was to go overseas, they are now looking at finding ways to investigate cultural competence here in North America. This way they could drive from location to location and not have to fly to countries where there are travel bans/quarantine rules due to the global pandemic. They hope to send a change in itinerary to the Lily Foundation by the end of March to see if they would still cover some time away for Pastor Brenda. We will let you know what they learn.
