#### A New Ministry, Sabbatical, and Reflections

In November, I had the opportunity to talk with some folks about a new ministry at Bethel. This new ministry is connected to the sabbatical time away I will have in 2020 (June 10 - Sept. 10). Throughout this year, we are all invited to participate in small groups that will take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI) and work together to close the gap each of us have between how "woke" we think we are and how "woke" we actually are when it comes to understanding the differences and similarities between various cultures. [I am going to call this process closing your 'woke" gap.] This particular inventory is very strong in providing particular information and suggestions for participants to grow in faith, love and respect for one another.

At the beginning of 2020, you will see a chart that includes some timing information about each Bethel small group that will participate in this ministry. All who are interested will be asked to attend an initial meeting, take an on-line survey, meet individually with the facilitator, meet as a group with the facilitator, and finally work (as a group, as well as individually) to close your gap of development. Although that may sound like too many meetings, I promise you that this process is well worth your time and well-being. And you and your group gets to decide when you will meet, how often, and where. So, some groups might be together for 4 months, some over a year, another somewhere in-between.

To help scheduling, Dr. Jen will become an official IDI facilitator in April of 2020, so that we have access to someone right here at Bethel. I will also be trained in October of next year. Prior to that time, we will be using other facilitators for our small groups who begin this process before April of 2020. There are several local facilitators that I know and trust to treat you well!

Some of the things you and your group might do to close your "woke" gap include reading and discussing books, watching particular movies, listening to certain podcasts or watching particular TV shows, eating in an area of the cities where you are the minority, stepping outside your cultural comfort zones, and seeing special speakers both inside and outside of Bethel. All with the support of your small group, so you know you are not in this alone.

So, who wants to join a small group? Look for our sign up sheets in early January!

Reading various books to work on closing my "woke" gap, and helping a task force provide some speakers and movies from which to learn. Although I will be gone for three months of 2020, I will spend some of that time continuing my IDI work as Mary and I go on a four week vacation overseas. We look forward to finding places where various cultures cooperate and collide in London, The Netherlands, Norway, Belgium, and Germany. We will also rest and play while we are on this vacation together.

The other eight weeks of my sabbatical time will include a couple of retreats, fishing, family, rest, learning ASL, relaxing, and preparing for my return to Bethel. I look forward to sharing this entire ministry process with all of you! Thank you for your support and understanding my need for a sabbatical.

Please keep these things in mind when you hear the word "Stewardship." Thanks for reading!

Child care will be available during the worship service.








#### Christmas Carols

Take a minute or two now and name as many Christmas carols/hymns as you can. Now, do the same with Lenten hymns. How is it that most people can name many more Christmas hymns than Lenten ones when the season of Lent is much longer and there are 30 percent more Lenten hymns than Christmas ones in the hymnal?

Some of the most recognizable music in churches today is heard around the Advent and Christmas season. There's something touching when the music of *Silent Night* is sung and heard in candlelight; something reminiscent when the words of Away in a



Silent Night celebrated its 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary last year and has been a celebrated carol translated into hundreds of languages worldwide and sung by everybody from Bethel churchgoers to Mariah Carey. But there are some carols that date even further back. The popular Advent carol, O Come, O Come, Emmanuel's tune dates back to the 15<sup>th</sup> century. Many carols were popularized by other composers who used the original tune to create their own variations and settings. One of the tunes that was a popular choice for composers was the 15-verse hymn, *From Heaven Above*. The vast number of organ arrangements by dozens of composers over centuries showed that the simple melody allowed for these variations to be written and the importance of the text tied to those notes.

The service of *Nine Lessons and Carols* was popularized at King's College Chapel, Cambridge, England in 1918 to engage a weary, unenthusiastic church crowd. This pairing of readings and music brought people together to hear the great word of Jesus' birth. The service is still held to this day every Christmas Eve where it is broadcast live to millions of listeners worldwide. The opening hymn, Once in Royal David's City, is sung by a solo boy chorister who is identified only seconds before the music begins to avoid excessive anxiety. Old and new carols are performed every year with new ones being composed by the college's choirmaster yearly.

So many carols, so little time! I hope the carols you hear this Advent and Christmas season will remind you of the past, bring you peace in the present and make memories for the future.
